
CREATING PUPPETS

1. All of the puppets started as sketches. At this stage, the puppet designer, Andrew, drew exactly what he wanted the puppets to look like!












Gibberish Charades

Dad has a difficult time understanding Trixie. Now it's your turn to test your gibberish skills! This game is most fun with at least four people, so grab family and friends!

- 1. Before the game begins, players brainstorm and discuss some simple actions or phrases, such as "I stubbed my toe!" or "I love you!"
- 2. Each player chooses one of the phrases—but keep it secret!
- 3. When the game starts, each player stands in front of the other participants and acts out their phrase; however, they can only use gibberish words! For example, a player choosing "I stubbed my toe" could grab their foot and jump around in pain while shouting "Ba doo be dah! Ba doo be dah!"
- 4. Other participants try to guess the player's phrase or action.
- 5. Make sure everyone has the chance to perform in gibberish!

THE AUTHORS

MO WILLEMS' (Original Author, Book, Lyrics) work in children's books, animation, television, theater, and bubble gum card painting have garnered him 3 Caldecott Honors, 2 Geisel Medals, 6 Emmy Awards, 5 Geisel Honors, a Helen Hayes nomination, and multiple bubble gum cards. He is best known for his characters Knuffle Bunny, The Pigeon, and Elephant and Piggie and his work as a writer and animator for PBS's SESAME STREET. He is worst known for his work on Cartoon Network's SHEEP IN THE BIG CITY and Nickelodeon's THE OFF-BEATS. Mo also makes sculptures and writes plays. MICHAEL SILVERSHER (Composer) is a Grammy Award winning songwriter (ELMO IN GROUCHLAND), with three primetime Emmy nominations, including two for WINNIE-THE-POOH and one for THE MUPPETS who collaborated with Joy Sikorski to create SING BABY SING, an exclusive prenatal and infant music singing CD for moms, dads, grandparents, nurses and early childhood educators. Currently the composer for the background music of the hit children's TV show, DINOSAUR TRAIN, songwriter for PAJANIMALS and composer/co-lyricist for KNUFFLE BUNNY, which premiered at the Kennedy Center. In collaboration with Patty Silversher, he also wrote the theme songs for Disney's television series, TALE SPIN and GUMMI BEARS. Together they have over one hundred songs in the Disney catalog.

THE DIRECTOR

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Welcome to the world of Knuffle Bunny. It's a lot like our world, except with more puppets. In KNUFFLE BUNNY, people have places to go and things to do. Laundry has to get done. Parenting is trickier than it looks. The people we love are still a mystery, particularly the pre-verbal ones. I mean, really, what DO they want?

But let's be honest, are the highly articulate members of our family actually any easier to understand? We all love people that we will never totally comprehend. Sure, Trixie will grow up and she'll be able to stop saying "aggle flaggle" and start saying "Mom and Dad, I'd really like to join the soccer team," but she's never going to be less of a mystery to her dad. And he'll never be less of a mystery to her.

We don't know what goes on inside another person. We can ask and we can guess, but we don't know. But for the people we love, understanding everything they want or think or need isn't a barrier. We believe in them — we know that they will move mountains for us, or fight sentient laundry monsters to rescue our stuffed bunny from the washing machine. And that we will do the same for them. That's what matters. Love lets us have the courage to believe in one another. And that faith is not conditional on comprehension. It's what we do for one another that matters. Sometimes the best way we prove that faith is when we forgive each other when we get it wrong (usually because we don't understand), when we stick with each other, and keep going on that journey together.


