A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

As children, long before we learned to read on our own, stories were read to us to inspire learning and spark creativity. We relied on our imaginations and the storytellers around us to bring words on a page to life. This, I believe, is why theater is so enchanting—the storytelling on stage reminds us of those early years spent eagerly listening to fairy tales and quests of adventure. As a director and performer, I have always enjoyed watching an audience full of excited children engage with the actors, design, music, and story. Now that my two-and-a-halfyear-old is attending shows, I'm getting to experience this excitement from a different perspective—as a mother whose heart is happy to know he is entertained and learning at the very same time. I'm particularly fond of this witty show for several reasons. First, I saw my husband perform in its world premiere at Chicago Shakespeare Theater in 2010. Second, it was crafted by talented Northwestern graduates (and dear friends of mine) for both children and the adults that accompany them. Third, I appreciate how this adaptation focuses on compassion as a tool to better understand the people in our lives. In a world where even the smallest of differences can divide us, it is nice to know that a little compassion can lead to healing, peace, and harmony. My biggest hope is that this version of The Emperor's New Clothes will spark dialogues about compassion and help us communicate with the world around
