DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I remember reading this play around eighteen years of age. I couldn't understand it. Maybe it was the language, maybe it was the memory aspect of it, but for some reason, it just seemed...inconsequential to me at the time. Flash forward twenty years, to mid-career in my life as an artist: this play now speaks volumes to me as a first-generation Chinese American son of immigrants who moved to America to pursue their dream of happiness.

I reread this play at the age of thirty-seven. It struck me to the core. What is more, throughout the rehearsal process of this audio drama it struck my actors in a way that I could not have imagined. The story of Tom Wingfield—the story of Tennessee Williams—is the story of any minority group striving for representation and recognition in the eyes of American society. From the outside we are viewed as the "unadventurous," with no place in American popular culture; moreover, this is how we are often viewed from the inside as well. But there are those of us who long for adventure, who need it to be everyone's dish, "not only Gable's. Then the people in the dark room come out of the dark room to have some adventures themselves."

I hope that my point of view on this classic can open new doors into my community and perhaps spark conversations about older generations imposing their ideals upon younger generations without opening their ears and hearts to how the world of the young is no longer the world of the old. Because either way, it is not a one-way street. Our current predicament most certainly begs this kind of discourse.


