COMPANY BIOS

DAVID CATLIN (Director) is a founding Ensemble Member of Lookingglass. Writing/Directing Credits include: *Mary Shelley's Frankenstein, Moby Dick* (Joseph Jefferson Best Production), and *Lookingglass Alice* (including a return engagement at Lookingglass summer 2022). He will direct Michael Hollinger's *Mr. Dickens' Hat* late fall 2021 for Northlight. David is an Artistic Associate with Actors Gymnasium and serves as Head of Undergraduate Acting at Northwestern University.

JERRELL L. HENDERSON (Director) is a Theatre Director, Puppeteer, and Professor of Performance Studies at Chicago State University. His *Juneteenth Puppet Protest: The Welcome Table* was featured in the New York Times (June 2020) and his Fall 2020 puppetry celebration of the lives of John Lewis and C.T. Vivian titled *Black Butterfly* was later expanded into an educational performance piece with Tria Smith of Guild Row and a student collective working with Urban Growers Collective also on Chicago's South Side.

HAMID DEHGHANI (Associate Producer, Assistant Director) Hamid Dehghani (Director): A second-year MFA directing candidate at Northwestern University, Hamid graduated from Tehran University of Art in Iran with a bachelor's degree in Theatre Directing. Hamid has received several awards as an actor, playwright, and director from International Festivals in Iran. In Tehran, he worked professionally in the theatre for more than 10 years until he moved to the United States in 2018 to continue his education. Most recently, he directed *A Moment of Silence* by Mohammad Yaghoubi at Northwestern in 2019.

REBECCA J. LISTER (Stage Manager) is a Stage Manager and Teaching Artist based in Chicago, IL. She is overjoyed to be back with Northwestern University, where she previously managed *Hedda Gabler, The Exonerated, Eurydice,* and *A Mother's Song.* Her other credits include *Cleopatra Boy* with A Host of People (Stage Manager) and *Why Torture is Wrong...* with Eclipse Theatre (Assistant Stage Manager). She graduated from Oakland University in 2019.

VIA GREENE (Assistant Stage Manager) is a rising junior studying theatre management and global health. Her last Wirtz Center appearance was *Tomas and The Library Lady* (SM). Other credits include: *Joni: Busy Being Free* (SM), *The Fig and the Wasp* (SM), *Legally Blonde* (ASM), and Chicago Immersive's *WANDER: Lincoln Square* (ASM). 
