LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We are on sacred ground. Northwestern University is on the traditional homelands of the people of the Council of Three Fires—the Ojibwe, Potawatomi, and Odawa—as well as the Menominee, Miami, and Ho-Chunk nations. Before it was stolen from them through colonization and forced removal, this land was a site of trade, travel, gathering, and healing for more than a dozen other native tribes. The state of Illinois is still home to more than 100,000 tribal members. In the spirit of healing and making amends for the harm that was done, we acknowledge the native and indigenous peoples who called this land home. And we pledge ourselves as members of the Northwestern School of Communication to turn our statements into action and build better relationships with native and indigenous communities in Evanston, in Chicago, and throughout the region.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

As a director, I gravitate toward plays that are gut-wrenching, stories that take your heart right out of your chest and set it aflame in front of you. *Blood Wedding* is one of those plays. When I first read it, I felt a kindred spirit in Lorca. He was a man with ferocious bravery, who was openly himself at a time when queerness was even more condemned. He was fighting against societal norms and choosing to live fully and freely until August 19, 1936 when he was murdered for it.

It is true to me that in each generation, there's a realization that the foundation we stand upon is broken and we want dismantle it. I believe this play to be Lorca's call for liberation, this was his way of dismantling the system. With an incantation that love will lead the way to freedom. He gifts us a story about a community trapped by a traditional patriarchal structure, abiding by societal expectation, and wrestling with an unlived life. We watch as their suppressed, animalistic desires begin to seep out, like steam seeping out of a boiling kettle until it's screaming to be heard. Lorca pulls back the curtain and unveils this broken system, exposing it and the turmoil, chaos, and death it has caused.

Death, yes. But not in vain. Two men die for love.
