LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We are on sacred ground. Northwestern University is on the traditional homelands of the people of the Council of Three Fires—the Ojibwe, Potawatomi, and Odawa—as well as the Menominee, Miami, and Ho-Chunk nations. Before it was stolen from them through colonization and forced removal, this land was a site of trade, travel, gathering, and healing for more than a dozen other native tribes. The state of Illinois is still home to more than 100,000 tribal members. In the spirit of healing and making amends for the harm that was done, we acknowledge the native and indigenous peoples who called this land home. And we pledge ourselves as members of the Northwestern School of Communication to turn our statements into action and build better relationships with native and indigenous communities in Evanston, in Chicago, and throughout the region.

DIRECTOR AND DRAMATURG STATEMENT

As theatre artists, storytelling is our medium. We're tasked with using words, bodies, objects, light, and sound to bring a story to life. But it's more than that, isn't it? Through this process, we also bring ourselves to life. Because stories bring people together, like now. And stories can reveal something about ourselves. They can lead to our deepest knowing.

The characters in *Indecent* are, quite literally, revived by storytelling. And though their bodies were taken from them, in our production, their souls have remained in this space. A space akin to an old attic. Where past and present collide, and time moves differently. A space of memory, and history. Indeed, the perfect space to tell a story or two. This play is about many things: the plight of immigrants, artistic censorship, homophobia, antisemitism, the importance of art, the belief that love transcends gender, but chiefly, it is about the power theatre has in creating community for those who have been "othered." An artist. A queer person. An immigrant. A Jew. The people of these identities are similar in that they are all drawn to storytelling and the opportunity to share who they are. And who they are is diverse and complex and deeply rooted in community. There is a story to learn from each of them.

While Indecent was inspired by a play first written and performed in Europe over a century ago, it couldn't be more timely for us here today. In a time filled with so much hate, it is particularly hard to stand proud in who you are — especially when, for many, who you are is deemed criminal or falsely compared to some horrific act. To think, the arrest and censorship trial that inspired this play took place exactly 100 years ago, and in the U.S. today there are still plays you can't produce, books you can't read, words you can't say, and people who can't exist freely or safely. This is a harsh reality with which to be faced. But storytelling is an important and meaningful tool to combat this negativity. Working on Indecent has brought light and love to our community, our kehillah. And though hate remains on the outside, the community we've built within this process continues to counter it.

Thank you for joining us tonight in our act of resistance, in our act of love. We hope you enjoy our little Jewish play.

months. In the past, you may have seen Michael perform in shows such as Fun Home, Romeo and Juliet, and Mamma Mia!. Thank you Barbara!


